# Sanctuary Service Protocols Weekly Prayer Concerns

- In person worship is at 9:30 a.m.
- Sunday school classes, the nursery, children/ youth gatherings, coffee, and other hospitality services are currently suspended.
- While FCC and the State recommendations are good benchmarks, we invite all people to worship with us based on their comfort lev-el. Virtual services are offered (facebook.com/fcchsv, twitch.tv/fcchsv, or First Christian Church Huntsville on Youtube) every Sunday.
- Attendees, including children, will wear face coverings/masks inside the church and practice social distancing (6 feet apart for nonhousehold members) for everyone's safety.
- Attendance is limited (approximately 75) to the ability to social distance and the service will be broadcast (107.9) to the parking lot in the event of overflow attendance.
- Enter the church through the Bell Tower Garden/Narthex doors. The doors by the church office will be locked.
- Greeters will provide hand sanitizer to all who enter and provide masks for those who have not brought their own.
- Ushers will seat people down the center/side aisles
- No choir/congregational singing.
- Following the service, rows will **leave by the side aisles** with the east aisle exiting through Family Services and the west aisle through the Narthex doors. (There will be directional signs.)
- Offerings may be placed in the brass plate when exiting the sanctuary or sent by mail.
- Please, no congregating indoors before or after service - social distancing outdoors.
- Anyone with any symptoms will remain home and celebrate virtually for at least 14 days.
- Notify the church office immediately if you develop symptoms after attending a service.

# **CWM AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH FOCUS FOR FEBRUARY COMMUNITY FREE DENTAL CLINIC**

Have you ever experienced a broken or

abscessed tooth? If so, you may be fortunate enough to have a dentist you called for help with this health crisis or you may have sort help in an emergency room. If the later is the case, the emergency room is not



equipped to help with dental extractions. There are local dentists who try to help with such need based emergencies in their offices when possible, but today's COVID safety concerns make that situation even more problematic.

Madison County, Alabama, is very fortunate to have a not for profit Community Free Dental Clinic available to serve the qualifying adult community. Those residents, 19 and older with incomes equal to or less than 150% of the poverty level, may make appointments for extractions and education leading to improved oral health. The general good health of any adult is so dependent upon the health of the mouth. Please consider financial support of this outreach during the month of February. As we "count our blessings and name them one by one", remember the good oral health blessing.

#### **GOD IS IN THE WATERS**

"This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." - Matthew 3:17 (NRSV)

I was talking to someone the other day who expressed their discomfort with immersion baptism. "Why does it look like they're drowning?" she asked. I explained that it's ... because they are. There's an ending symbolized in the ritual.

But the gift of baptism and of the resurrection it promises is this: There will always be a new beginning. There is no such thing as an end. Death does not win. The grave has no victory.

And God is in the waters, cooling things down. Bringing the matter from flame-hot to cool-enough to hold tenderly. God is in the cooling, the cleansing, the moment that we arise from holding our breath.

God is in the first step we take when we can safely leave the house unmasked.

God is in the first embrace when we can safely give our at-risk elders who have missed us so much.

God is in the waters, and God is in all these moments of healing. Because that's what baptism is all about.

My child schooled me about this recently, by the way. She is eager for her own baptism. And my husband asked her, "Well, what does baptism mean to you?" She answered, "It's like you get to take a shower all day long, forever." (As you can imagine, she loves showers.)

God is in the shower.

God is in the waters.

God is in the cleansing.

God is in the fresh start.

God is.

And while that incendiary blaze of evil tries to set you off your course and burn the wrong things down, just remember:

God is in the water saying, "Chill. Be calm."
