# DON'T GIVE UP, TAKE UP

As I write this article a week has passed since we entered the season of Lent through our celebration of Ash Wednesday. As a community we opened ourselves to God, asked forgiveness for our sins, and then marked ourselves with ashes as an act of contrition. For the next 40 days, not counting Sundays, Christians will be engaged in a time of penitence in which we bring before God the brokenness and evil in our lives and in the world. Lent is also a time of spiritual renewal and preparation in which we focus our faith so we can truly appreciate the Paschal Mystery shown during Holy Week.

During the Lenten Season it has become customary to give something up for these 40 days. To do away with an aspect of our lives that we will miss so we can experience, in a small way, the temptations and testing that Jesus felt not only in the wilderness but also on his final journey to Jerusalem. Unfortunately, when we give up something for Lent it is usually a habit that we should have already gotten rid of in the first place, like drinking soda or eating chocolate, or a practice whose absence will not inhibit our lives, like watching television or keeping up with social media.

That is why I like to suggest that Christians take something up for Lent. This is not a new idea, I will admit, but it is one that makes more sense to me. The practice brings forth the ideals of renewal and transformation that are so crucial to the season. Some options might be; attending one of our Small Groups before or after worship service or on Wednesday nights, resolving to pray twice a day, reading the scriptures or studying the Bible once a day, performing an act of charity, volunteering to help our children or youth programs, joining a church committee, there are many options. These acts encourage the development of a deeper communion with God and with other people.

For the last few weeks the scripture lessons for Sunday have focused on the beginning of Jesus' ministry and the power of his teachings. Common in each of these scripture lessons is the understanding that our faith calls us to action. As we take up our cross and walk with Christ we are called to strengthen our lives of faith, provide justice, proclaim peace, encourage hope, and love one another. It is my hope that Lent can be an opportunity to center our lives on these ideals so we can become closer to God and to each other.

Thanks be to God. Amen.

Girls and sometimes their mothers cannot attend school because the family cannot afford feminine hygiene products, and so the girls stay home from school or their mothers from work. Our emphasis will be on the girls' needs.

Community Outreach (CO) supports three schools with needs for girls without monies to buy these products. The schools are Huntsville Junior High School, McNair School, Morris School. CO has been informed that school nurses, because of health reasons, prefers that sanitary pads be supplied.
