

CONGRATULATIONS TO DR. SHARIFA LOVE-RUTLEDGE

Dr. Sharifa Love-Rutledge, an assistant professor in the chemistry department at The University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) has been named to a list of "1,000 Inspiring Black Scientist."



The list was compiled by Cell Mentor, an organization that strives to "help hardworking scientists answer the questions that will propel them through satisfying, challenging, diverse careers in the life sciences." The list is made up of postdoctoral fellows, instructors and more.

Dr. Love-Rutledge is one of 18 Black scientists and researchers recognized with this honor from the state of Alabama. She is also the first Black woman to earn a Ph.D. from The University of Alabama Department of Chemistry. Her area of special research at UAH includes diabetes and insulin resistance, as well as cognitive decline and aging. As the Principal Investigator in the Love-Rutledge Lab, her efforts are focused on applying biochemistry and molecular biology to understanding and preventing diabetes in adults, such as Type 1 Latent Autoimmune Diabetes of adults and Type 2 diabetes.

"At every step of my journey I have relied upon God to open doors for me," she says. "I feel that I was led to be here. As a senior chemistry major, I attended an Instrumental Colloquium at UA. We met several of the faculty and saw the instrumentation. My advisor mentioned to one of the faculty that I was applying. I applied on Saturday, and I was accepted that Monday! I took that as a sign that this is where I was destined to be."

BACK FROM THE DEAD

He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know."

- Ezekiel 37:3 (NRSV)

The preacher's voice rang through the historic sanctuary, amplified not by a sound system but by the gift of colonial architectural acoustics and the power of his own breath. "Prophesy to these bones," he cried, and the silent congregation held its breath in response.

As a little girl sitting in the balcony with my Sunday school class, I heard the power of God in our pastor's voice, even if the scriptural verses about a valley full of dry bones sounded more like Halloween to me than a lead-up to Easter. I was too young to hear the story as a metaphor. It must be true, so what couldn't God do?

That voice sounded in my head many decades later, as I looked for answers in a season of depression and despair. I had a crumbling marriage, young children to support, and no job. Who would put the breath back in my body?

I spent some time lamenting on my couch, hoping vaguely that God would make it better as if by magic. Yet the text tells us there is more to it. Restoration is a combined effort. Prophesy to the bones, says God, and the prophet responds. One day I realized I was not alone. God would bring me back from what felt like the grave, and I would live. The work begins when we speak to each other, and to ourselves.

Who is waiting for this faith, this confidence, to ring out in your voice? Prophesy to these bones. Call out so they can hear you and come back from the dead.

Prayer - Holy God, give us strong voices to reach the people who need you most, that we may all live. Amen.

Sanctuary Service Protocols

- In person worship is at 9:30 a.m.
- Sunday school classes, the nursery, children/ youth gatherings, coffee, and other hospitality services are currently suspended.
- While FCC and the State recommendations are good benchmarks, we invite all people to worship with us based on their comfort level. Virtual services are offered (facebook.com/fcchsv, twitch.tv/fcchsv, or First Christian Church Huntsville on Youtube) every Sunday.
- Attendees, including children, will wear face coverings/masks inside the church and practice social distancing (6 feet apart for nonhousehold members) for everyone's safety.
- Attendance is limited (approximately 75) to the ability to social distance and the service will be broadcast (107.9) to the parking lot in the event of overflow attendance.
- Enter the church through the Bell Tower Garden/Narthex doors. The doors by the church office will be locked.
- Greeters will provide hand sanitizer to all who enter and provide masks for those who have not brought their own.
- Ushers will seat people down the center/side aisles
- No choir/congregational singing.
- Following the service, rows will **leave by the side aisles** with the east aisle exiting through Family Services and the west aisle through the Narthex doors. (There will be directional signs.)
- Offerings may be placed in the brass plate when exiting the sanctuary or sent by mail.
- Please, **no congregating indoors** before or after service social distancing outdoors.
- Anyone with any symptoms will remain home and celebrate virtually for at least 14 days.
- Notify the church office immediately if you develop symptoms after attending a service.
