## **Easter is Not One Day**

Easter is almost here. By the time you receive this newsletter we will be in the midst of Holy Week and if you are like my family you are getting ready for guests, dying eggs, making sure the Easter Baskets are in order, and finalizing plans for the meal. Easter is an important day in the life of the church and in our families, but we should also remember the importance of Holy Week. Palm Sunday is a day of celebration, but it is also a reminder that the cross is on the horizon. As we travel through the week we journey with Jesus to the upper room for an intimate meal, we move to the garden and pray for the cup to be taken, we see Jesus arrested, tried, tortured, and then stumble to the cross on Good Friday. There is pain and sorrow in Holy Week. We have to remember that our reconciliation with God did not come without sacrifice.

The same might be said about the Easter season because the celebration of Easter is more than one day. I always think that after Easter is over my schedule will miraculously clear and I will have more time, but I am always mistaken. For many Holy Week and Easter have become times of stress just like the Advent and Christmas season. We become so wrapped up in details that it is easy to forget what Easter means. We are celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ, but also the knowledge that God's covenantal promises are kept, our sins are forgiven, we are renewed and transformed, and can find new life through Christ.

The Easter season, or Eastertide, continues until Pentecost, May 28, our joy is so great that we must continue rejoicing! In reality every Sunday is a mini-Easter, an opportunity to give thanks for the love of God, the presence of Christ, and the support of the Holy Spirit. The celebration of Easter is only the beginning for we are called to live in the image of Christ and work to provide a vision of the Kingdom of God here on earth.

Perhaps what we need is a change of focus for Easter. It is not one day of worship and family celebration; Easter is an experience that changes our lives every day. The miracle of Easter reaches out and fills us to overflowing so that we cannot help but spread the good news of Jesus Christ. It is my desire that the message of Easter and the glory of Eastertide will continue to strengthen your faith, encourage your actions, and give you hope for the future. Amen.

In Huntsville and other communities, feminine hygiene products deserts exist. Girls and sometimes their mothers cannot attend school because the family cannot afford feminine hygiene products, and so the girls stay home from school or their mothers from work. Our emphasis will be on the girls' needs.

Community Outreach (CO) supports three schools with needs for girls without monies to buy these products. The schools are Huntsville Junior High School, McNair School, Morris School. CO has been informed that school nurses, because of health reasons, prefers that sanitary pads be supplied.

CO has a collection site in the church and delivers the donations to the Health Officer, at Huntsville City Schools Auxiliary Office on Bob Wallace. They have distributed the donations as needed at the schools. This past month 14 packages were delivered. Margaret J. Vann
