GET READY FOR CHANGE

When faced with new circumstances in you life, you have at least three options for how to respond. First, you can stay bewildered. You can let this event knock you flat on your back and then stay there. Second, you can engage in denial. You can look at the facts and ignore them. Or third, you can, slowly perhaps, assimilate this new information. You may get knocked as flat on your back as the next person by this new realization, but eventually you pick yourself up. You embrace this new truth and then go through the long, sometimes painful, process of re-assessing life in the light of this new evidence.

This is the choice we face during Holy Week and Easter. When faced with the incredible proclamation that Jesus rose from the dead, you can choose to say that you don't know what to make of this but then neither are you going to try. You can deny it, the whole thing is fiction, a pious wish but something that never really happened. Or you can move past the shock toward acceptance. But let me caution you: if you are going to accept the truth of the resurrection, it will change you totally.

Easter is the center, the good news, of our faith. The resurrection is an act of power and love that is the ultimate answer to the promises of God, proof that death was defeated and new life offered to all people. It also provides hope for our future as we look forward to the day when Christ will come again. However, we often forget that Easter Sunday does not signal the end of this celebration. The season of Easter, or Easter-tide, will not end until Pentecost Sunday on May 23rd. During this season we are reminded that the glory of resurrection is only the beginning of our journey of faith. Through the appearances of Jesus to his followers after he was raised from the dead, we find that there are still lessons to be learned and work to be done

At its essence, the season of Easter is a reminder that new life brings change, yet we are so deeply tied to old convictions and our own brokenness that this prospect brings a sense of loss and overwhelming fear. It is at these times that we must remember that resurrection cannot occur without loss and pain. Jesus had to suffer and die on the cross so he could be raised from the dead, so too are we called to suffer, deny our selfish hearts, and give of ourselves, so that we may become true followers of God.

This may seem like an impossible task, but our God has always made the impossible, possible. The courage and strength that is needed can be found in many ways, Bible study, meditation, prayer, and corporate worship, in fact, the church was created to unify believers as the family of God so we could mutually encourage our lives of faith. It is my sincere hope that the Easter season will be a time of renewal for us all. As we celebrate the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ let us remember our call to faith, encourage one another in love, and spread the good news of the gospel throughout our community and world.

Sanctuary Service Protocols

- In person worship is at 9:30 a.m.
- Sunday school classes, the nursery, children/youth gatherings, coffee, and other hospitality services are currently suspended.
- While FCC and the State recommendations are good benchmarks, we invite all people to worship with us based on their comfort level. Virtual services are offered (facebook.com/fcchsv, twitch.tv/fcchsv, or First Christian Church Huntsville on Youtube) every Sunday.
- Attendees, including children, will wear face coverings/masks inside the church and practice social distancing (6 feet apart for non-household members) for everyone's safety.
- Attendance is limited (approximately 75) to the ability to social distance and the service will be broadcast (107.9) to the parking lot in the event of overflow attendance.
- Enter the church through the Bell Tower Garden/Narthex doors. The doors by the church office will be locked.
- Greeters will provide hand sanitizer to all who enter and provide masks for those who have not brought their own.
- Ushers will seat people down the center/side aisles
- No choir/congregational singing.
- Following the service, rows will **leave by the side aisles** with the east aisle exiting through Family Services and the west aisle through the Narthex doors. (There will be directional signs.)
- Offerings may be placed in the brass plate when exiting the sanctuary or sent by mail.
- Please, no congregating indoors before or after service social distancing outdoors.
- Anyone with any symptoms will remain home and celebrate virtually for at least 14 days.
- Notify the church office immediately if you develop symptoms after attending a service.
