### DEAR DISCIPLES

This week we mark the ascension of our Lord and we prepare to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit next week on Pentecost Sunday. As I was studying the lectionary text this week, I was struck by the excitement of the disciples. Even as Jesus is preparing to leave them, Jesus reminds them, he points them back to scripture. He reminds them of what the prophets foretold about his ministry and his life. And he reminds them that a gift is coming that he is going to send - a gift, a helper, a comforter, the Gospel of John tells us - someone who will help them to remember all the things that Jesus has taught.

And as Jesus blesses them in the Luke version of the ascension, and disappears before them, they are worshiping and praising God. And the scripture ends by telling us that the disciples are continually found in the temple praising God. They have hope after a season of great disruption.

Church, it has been 14, 15 months since most of us were in lockdown in the pandemic. And as we begin to see the light at the end of the tunnel because of vaccines - thank God for science that is helping us to live more protected lives - I feel like we need a revival, a fresh wind, fresh fire, a reminder of the fact that God has indeed equipped us to emerge from this time, just as he equipped those first disciples, those first believers who lived through the disruption of the crucifixion and the resurrection. They emerged full of hope and praise because they were pointed back to scripture. And they found hope in inhabiting the praise of God.

I hope that as we move forward in this time, as we prepare for celebrating the precious gift of the Holy Spirit, that you, too, will point yourselves back to scripture, that you will continue to build those habits of spiritual practice so that we can do the work that we've been called to do, so that we, too, can be rejoicing in worship, hearing God speak to us, having God provide us with the strength, and the fortitude, the vigor, and the excitement that we will need as we move forward as a new church in a new world. I'm excited. I need a revival. I'm going to take this opportunity this Pentecost to feel the fire, to let it fall, and recommit myself to doing the work of the kingdom. Won't you join me in recommitting ourselves to emerge as a new church for this new world?

May the Holy Spirit give us all that we need. May the Holy Spirit reenergize, refuel, recommit us to doing the work of God's kingdom. Jesus would want it, so let's be followers of Jesus Christ. Let's be the church that we say we are! God bless you, Disciples. Remember that God loves you, and so do I.

# UPDATE ON SALVATION ARMY MOBILE KITCHEN

Every third Tuesday of the month, FCC volunteers drive and serve for two locations of the Salvation Army Mobile Kitchen. From 25 -50 people receive a meal prepared by the Salvation Army on Seminole



Drive. This service requires two to three people for 1 1/2 hours, 5:15 - 6:45 PM. No special driver's license is required, however the driver must complete an application and have a good driving record for SA insurance purposes. #### **NEW COVID-19 PROTOCOLS**

The Board met by Zoom on Saturday, May 22, and approved the following protocols. They include changes proposed by the Worship Committee and approved by the Board on May 13.

- Fully vaccinated individuals may choose to attend with or without masks. Attendees who are not fully vaccinated, and children who are able, will continue to wear face coverings/ masks inside the church until further notice.
- There will only be **one 9:30 a.m. service** offered for the next 12 months. First Christian Church offers virtual services (facebook.com/fcchsv, twitch.tv/fcchsv, or First Christian Church Huntsville on YouTube) every Sunday. While FCC and State recommendations are good benchmarks, we invite all people to worship with us based on their comfort level.
- Hand sanitizer and masks are available for those who have not brought their own.
- Prepackaged communion elements will continue to be used and are available in the Narthex.
- The **nursery** will reopen on **June 6** for the 9:30 a.m. service and the 10:30 a.m. small group time.
- Attendance is limited (approximately 75) to the ability to social distance (6 feet apart for non-household members). Every other pew will be roped off for social distancing.
- Members may vocalize during the service, such as stating the Lord's Prayer, litanies, etc. We will begin singing the Doxology within the service and will look at adding more congregational music as state and national numbers continue to improve.
- Offerings may be placed in the brass plate when exiting the sanctuary or sent by mail.
- Food, coffee, and other hospitality services remain suspended until further notice.
- Small groups (including Sunday school classes) will meet at 8:30 a.m. or 10:30 a.m. and will begin meeting in person on June 6.
- An Intergenerational Small Group class for children, youth or any adults that wish to attend that will meet at 10:30 a.m. beginning June 6 and continuing through August.

## WHAT REMAINS TO BE DONE By Martha Spong

To Titus, my loyal child in the faith we share... I left you behind in Crete for this reason, so that you should put in order what remained to be done, and should appoint elders in every town, as I directed you. - Titus 1:4a & 5 (NRSV)

As Paul traveled from city to city, planting churches, he could not do the work alone. He needed trusted collaborators, like Titus, who he left behind to organize the leadership of a new faith community. Hearts and minds have been touched by Paul's preaching and teaching, and hope in Christ has been shared. Now it's time for logistics.

We're all called into ministry of some kind, to use the gifts God has given us. After more than a year in pandemic mode, we have learned to count on the people who excel at "put(ting) in order what remains to be done." Whether they offered medical expertise, recruited readers and singers for online worship, compiled and edited videos, devised phone lists for keeping in touch, or wiped down pews between services, our communities of faith have depended on the people who can perceive what's needed and know how to make it happen.

In other seasons of the church's life they serve on search committees, or organize mission studies, or make sure the Sunday School doesn't run out of crayons. They put their gifts and skills to work for the good of the whole when the idea people have moved on to the next project. We rely on their spreadsheets and phone trees and care for others.

We rely on them just as Paul relied on Titus.
