The Nova Center for Youth and Families helps teens overcome the psychological, behavioral, and emotional challenges that come with growing up in order to build strong, healthy relationships with themselves and their parents, families, and community. Nova collaborates with clients, parents, school personnel, and caretakers to develop a treatment plan and provides outpatient counseling to individuals, family therapy, group sessions, school-based services, juvenile court services, and related medical/ nursing services. In Huntsville and other communities, feminine hygiene products deserts exist.
