As we look over our beloved church building in 2024, we can see there are areas we need to maintain and improve to ensure a welcoming, comfortable, and accessible environment for all who come to worship and participate in our ministries. To this end, we are launching a three-year capital campaign with a goal of raising \$300,000. This campaign will fund crucial upgrades and repairs to our church facilities, including:

- 1. Upgrading our HVAC System, Most is Beyond its Life Expectancy,(\$122,000 +)
 - 2. Paying of our Roof Repair Loan(\$78,000)
- 3. Upgrading Restroom Facilities in the Basement and Across from the Church Office (\$90,000)
- 4. ADA-Compliant Hearing Aid System for the Sanctuary (\$10,000)

We invite you to prayerfully consider making a pledge to this capital campaign, above your commitment to the annual budget. Your contribution, no matter the size, will make an impact. Our congregation has a history of generous giving, and we are confident that with your support and prayers, we can achieve our goal of ensuring that First Christian Church continues to be a place of welcome that inspires delight for years to come.


The Church Office will be closed on Monday, September 2nd, in observance of Labor Day.
