#### **FACING FEARS**

It is hard to believe that summer is almost over. It seems like just a few weeks ago the kids were getting out of school, and we were planning summer vacation. Now the kids are back in school, and vacation is over. Where does the time go? Time is a precious commodity in our household. There is always something going on, a meeting to attend, yardwork to be done, homework to finish, laundry to sort, etc. Like most families we try to prioritize the things that are important to us, which means that sometimes we have to say no, or at least not right now, to activities in which we want to participate. We also find ourselves engaging in activities that we never expected to do.

Zip-lining is one such activity. I remember this excursion very well because it happened at a General Assembly. We let the kids choose one thing that they wanted to do, within reason. Joe decided he wanted to go to an amusement park, so we went to Six Flags. Abby told us she wanted to go Zip-lining. If you have never heard of this, you climb a tower, are strapped to a steel cable by a pulley, and then sent hurtling out into space, sliding down the cable until you reach the end. One of the rides we went on was over one hundred feet in the air, ¼ of a mile long, and the guide said I was going well over forty miles an hour when he hit the brake.

I loved it, Abby had a blast, Joe even enjoyed it, after a little convincing, but Patti was terrified. She had to psyche herself up every time she climbed a tower. When I asked her why she was doing this she said, "It is for the kids!" and in many ways that was true. But I also believe that Patti went zip-lining to overcome her fear of heights and falling. She had to trust her guide to prepare her pulley, rope her in, use the brake to slow her down, and keep her safe. I know how terrified she was, but she went down every zip-line. She was amazing.

There are a great deal of things in life that terrify us. Some things we should be scared of, but other fears are only in our minds. Often, we become so obsessed with what might happen that we convince ourselves to never to take a risk, to stay with what is comfortable or safe, and let the world pass us by. If we never try to confront our fears, or look beyond them, we limit ourselves and let our fear control us. Patti loved the first zip-lining experience so much that we went again, and she was able to enjoy herself. She did not look terrified, she looked exhilarated.

First Christian Church will be undergoing a great deal of change in the next few years. We are looking at major changes for our staff, the ministries that we participate in, and the programs we support. For many this can be terrifying. We are moving into the unknown and that always causes fear. Yet, the church has always continued in the face of difficulty and change because we worked together and sought God's will for our congregation, not our own. We have already made several courageous decisions. I am amazed and humbled by the faith of this church. Together we will walk out into the unknown, let out great Guide buckle us in, and then wait for the ride. I guarantee you; it will be worth it. Thanks be to God, Amen.
