We have just celebrated Labor Day weekend. Labor Day is an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American workers. It is a federal holiday to recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being. For many, it is the last weekend of the summer, and offers one more three-day weekend before the push of school, fall, and a long stretch of routine and rush. I hope you will share your Sabbath experiences with your church family and with me in the days ahead. Thanks be to God, Amen.
