# 2024 SPECIAL OFFERING REPAIRERS OF THE BREACH

"...you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in." —Isaiah 58:12 NRSV

They came to work. The group had come to serve a small community on the South Side of Chicago by lending helping hands to remove trash in open spaces. They also came to learn about the convergence of economic, environmental, and racial justice in this area which houses 50 landfills. On this day, the group sat at the feet of environmental justice advocates, listening to stories of how their activism resulted in successfully ending the practice of toxic waste dumping in their community. Our group was able to participate in this service-learning opportunity as recipients of a grant from Reconciliation Ministry.

Closer to home in our own region, Reconciliation Funds enable training for clergy, grants for congregational bridge building, and support for Alabama Arise (a grassroots organization which addresses public policy and its impact on the poor and marginalized persons in Alabama).
