### **WELLHOUSE**

CWM/AL/NWFL Regional Project for November

This worthwhile center provides residential and therapeutic programs to



female victims of human trafficking. This service was actually started by a survivor of human trafficking who saw the need for such a refuge. It is the largest single-site residential provider for victims in the US. 2020 data from a national hot line showed it to be pandemic-proof. They reported a 22% increase in online recruitment. 42% of victims were brought into human trafficking by a member of their family. In 2021 Wellhouse was able to finance and open a separate house on their campus just for children and teens.
