FIVE STEPS TO INVITE VISITORS TO CHURCH

With the Thanksgiving Holiday upon us, the season of Advent arriving soon, and Christmas and the New Year right around the corner now is a wonderful time to invite friends, family, and neighbors to church. We have a host of activities coming soon, including our Hanging of the Greens Service on November 27. The Funky Christmas Fashion Show on December 7, The Christmas Fest on December 10, the Festival of Carols on December 11, and of course our Christmas Eve and Day services, that will appeal to different people. I thought it might be a good idea to revisit how to invite others to our church.

Five Steps to Invite Visitors to Church

- 1. First of all, pray before inviting someone. See out God's guidance and ask the Holy Spirit to prompt you on whom you should invite. If you have someone in mind ask for assistance from God in this endeavor.
- 2. Ask the visitor if they would like to go WITH you. Do not throw an open invite, but instead offer to meet them:
 - Outside the main entrance of the church (and explain which entrance it is.),
 - At your home, so you can carpool together,
 - Offer to meet in the parking lot and walk in together,
 - Offer to meet before or after for a shared meal.
- 3. Explain what the service and the experience will look like. They may have questions such as :
 - What to wear,
 - How long the service is,
 - What to expect during the service,
 - How we take communion,
 - Which door should they enter if you aren't meeting them beforehand,
 - Whether are they expected to give,
 - and others.

Take away as much of the unknown as possible, making it less scary to attend.

- 4. Be by their side as they step into the unknown. Your presence will comfort them and give them the strength to see for themselves what church is really about. Sit with them, introduce them to others, and help them feel comfortable during the service.
- 5. Finally, follow up. If they attended church, follow up and ask what they thought. Are they interested in attending again? Did they have questions or concerns? Do they know where to start next? Getting them to church is a huge victory, but there is still work to be done.

I look forward to seeing you, and some new faces, throughout the Advent and Christmas season. May God bless and keep you. Amen.

CWM/AL/NWFL Regional Project for November

This worthwhile center provides residential and therapeutic programs to female victims of human trafficking. This service was actually started by a survivor of human trafficking who saw the need for such a refuge. It is the largest single-site residential provider for victims in the US. 2020 data from a national hot line showed it to be pandemicproof. They reported a 22% increase in online recruitment. 42% of victims were brought into human trafficking by a member of their family. In 2021 Wellhouse was able to finance and open a separate house on their campus just for children and teens.
