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## Thanksgiving and Advent message from the Office of General Minister and President

Hello, Disciples. My name is Lee Hull Moses and I serve in the Office of the General Minister and President. I bring greetings from our General Minister and President, who is on sabbatical for the next couple of months.

As many of us in the United States pause for the Thanksgiving holiday this week, I want you to know how grateful we in the Office of General Minister and President are for all of you, for the ministry you do, the ways you are serving your neighbors near and far, the ways you are caring for each other, the ways you are bearing witness to the limitless love of God we know through Jesus Christ.

Advent begins this week, right on the heels of Thanksgiving, as it often does – this season of waiting and watching and hoping, and as we enter Advent, I've been thinking about some words from poet Jane Kenyon – She was giving advice to writers, but I think it's good advice for people of faith, too. She says: "Be a good steward of your gifts. Protect your time. Feed your inner life. Avoid too much noise. Read good books, have good sentences in your ears."

I love that last bit – read good books, have good sentences in your ears. I've been trying to do that lately with my first cup of coffee in the morning, I try to keep starting the day with some good sentences, some good words – sometimes a poem, or a few pages of the novel I'm working on. Often, I find myself turning to the Psalms, those ancient words always remind me that throughout human history people have turned to God in complicated times to lift up their fear and their hope, their grief, their anger, their gratitude. The Psalms are very good words.

And there are so many good sentences, so many good words to keep in our ears, as we walk through the Advent season there's the visions of the prophets, there's Mary's Magnificat, the words of the angels that tell us we do not need to fear...

Personally, my favorite Advent words are from Zechariah, who promises that by the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us and guide our feet into the way of peace. (Luke 1:78-79) And then, of course, there is the Word, the Word who was with God, who is with God, who became flesh and lived among us – the word we are waiting for, the word who has already come.

So, church, what words will be in your ears in this season of waiting and watching? I pray that they will be words of blessing, gratitude, and hope.

## WE BELONG by Marilyn Pagán-Banks

But we do not belong to those who shrink back and are destroyed, but to those who have faith and are saved. - Hebrews 10:39 (NIV)

"Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness, that most frightens us. We ask ourselves, who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented, fabulous? Actually, who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small does not serve the world. There is nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We were born to make manifest the glory of God that is within us. It is not just in some of us, it is in everyone. And as we let our own light shine, we unconsciously give other people permission to do the same. No more trying to fit a narrative, a history, a story that isn't ours and doesn't want us anyway.

We are claiming our place. Creating our space. Embracing our power. Celebrating our ancestors. Reclaiming our heritage of strength in community. Stirring up the gifts of the people. Each person. We are dismantling and building all at the same time—with unchecked joy and audacious possibility.

**Prayer** - God of Glory, thank you for your still speaking word that reminds us that we belong to you and to one another.
