IRS CREDIT FOR 2023 GIVING

Please remember that all contributions to be credited toward 2023 giving must be received by the church office before 12:30 pm on Friday, December 29, 2023 (that is when the office closes for New Year's Eve) or in the collection plate on Sunday, December 31. Mailed contributions may be credited toward your 2023 giving as long as they are postmarked by December 30, 2023. (If mailing, make sure to note collection times to ensure the appropriate postmark.)

IRS regulations require that checks received after December 31, even if dated December 31 or prior (unless received by mail <u>postmarked</u> December 30 or prior), will be credited to your <u>2024</u> giving and <u>not</u> 2023.
