In addition to its more than 3,200 congregations and its General Ministries, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) expresses itself in 31 geographic areas called Regions. The Regions cover every part of the United States and Canada. The primary nature of Regional Ministries is to look after the congregations in their regions. Regions have two main purposes: nurture and mission. They are called to fulfill the mission of the Church by taking the lead in developing new forms of ministry in mission, witness, and service. Regions also are nurturing agents that provide support, guidance, and pastoral care to ministers and congregations.

Additionally, Regions play the role of counselor and advisor in matters such as the standing and credentialing of ministers, relocation of pastors, and filling vacant ministerial positions, among other responsibilities. Regions help find interim ministers for churches that are without full-time pastors.

Regional ministers often serve as mentors to congregational pastors. They offer training to clergy and laity and assistance in cases of difficulties between ministers and congregations. Regions call their staffs, own and manage their own property, determine their budgets and administer regional finances within their available resources. They hold regional assemblies and develop procedures for seeking counsel from the Office of General Minister and President.

"The mission of the Alabama-Northwest Florida Region is to encourage and equip its congregations and pastors for the ministry of Jesus Christ in local communities and throughout the world, while seeking to nurture them into deeper relationship with God, with each other, and with the whole Church."

Our Region has 57 congregations that are part of the family of Disciples in the Alabama-Northwest Florida Region. In covenant with one another, each congregation understands that it is a part of the larger Body of Christ and lives in relationship with other parts of the Body. Each congregation voluntarily commits to the work and mission of the whole church through prayers, involvement, and financial support.

The ministry of the Alabama-Northwest Florida Region is only possible through the voluntary commitment of individuals and congregations. The services and support the Region provides to congregations is a witness to our common commitment to one another. The Alabama-Northwest Florida Region provides a wide variety of ministries aimed at leadership development, congregational vitality, and spiritual renewal and growth. We are committed to the strengthening of our congregations as they give witness to the good news of God's grace in their communities. Our goal is to achieve excellence in our ministries. A major area of collaboration, led by the Region, is in the establishment of new congregations. The Region brings together committed leaders to give oversight to new church projects, guiding them as they are in formation.. The Region gave full recognition in 2021 to Pacific Islander Agape Church, Pensacola, FL as its newest congregation, and expects to give full recognition in 2022 to Iglesia Cristiana-Nuevo Comienzo in Oxford, AL.

The Region is a valuable partner with Christian Services for Children in Alabama (CSCA) which provides in-home services and therapeutic foster care to children who need special care in their growth and development. Through involvement on the CSCA Board and through sponsorship of an annual Christmas Party for the children and their families, the Disciples in the Region express support for this important ministry.

The Region encourages its congregations to stand with the poor and vulnerable by supporting the efforts of Alabama Arise, Greater Birmingham Ministries and other local advocacy groups.

COVID-19 CHURCH PROTOCOLS

(Approved by the Board on October 14.)

- One 9:30 a.m. service will be offered at least through May 2022. First Christian Church offers virtual services (facebook.com/fcchsv, twitch.tv/ fcchsv, or First Christian Church Huntsville on YouTube) every Sunday. While FCC and State recommendations are good benchmarks, we invite all people to worship with us based on their comfort level.
- Enter the church through the Bell Tower Garden/Narthex doors. The doors by the church office are locked.
- Wearing face coverings/masks at all times inside the church is encouraged for everyone.
- Hand sanitizer and masks are available at the Lobby Welcome Table along with prepackaged communion elements.
- The **nursery** is open for the 9:30 a.m. service and the 10:30 a.m. small group time.
- Every other row of pews is roped off on the pulpit side of the sanctuary to allow individuals to practice social distancing so that they may worship at their level of comfort. The front section on the pulpit side is the least impacted zone with our heating and cooling system.
- Attendees may vocalize during the service, such as stating the Lord's Prayer, litanies, etc., and sing hymns/songs when lyrics are projected on the screens.
- Offerings may be placed in the brass plate when exiting the sanctuary or sent by mail.
- Food, coffee, and other hospitality services remain suspended until further notice.
- Small groups (including Sunday school classes) will meet at 8:30 a.m. or 10:30 a.m.
- Anyone with any symptoms will remain home and celebrate virtually for at least 14 days.
- Please notify the church office immediately if you develop symptoms after attending service.
