CALLED TO BE FAITHFUL

Living as disciples of Jesus involves being transformed into Christ's image and having our orientation transformed from that of a consumer to that of a steward. Being a trustee of God's gifts in our lives doesn't come naturally. It requires intentionality and training. This is a mysterious thing and is part of the call extended by Paul in 1 Corinthians 4:1-2. In this short text Paul uses words that carry important images from his day.

"Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy." (1 Cor. 4:1-2)

The word Paul uses for "servant" is especially interesting. It is a Greek word which referred to a slave who would row on the lower tier of a two-tier rally war ship. Some commentators have built on this imagery and said that Jesus is the captain whose hand is at the wheel, directing the vessel, while we work with the oars that have been given to us to move the vessel forward. We are all invited to participate and "pull our weight" in the shared roles we have in moving the church forward. Each of us has our job, and Jesus desires willing and ready workers to do what needs to be done.

The other image is "steward," and here Paul uses the Greek word which refers to the chief servant in charge of a household. The chief steward controlled the staff, ordered supplies, and took care of related details, but he remained a servant nonetheless. Above all else the "steward" needed to be reliable and trustworthy. When the master would leave home and tend to other matters, he relied on his steward to care for matters until his return.

So how are we doing while the Master, Jesus, is away? What would Jesus say upon his return to our congregation after reviewing how we are working to move forward in mission and service? Are we using appropriately all that has been placed in our care?

Those are good stewardship questions. It certainly applies to our annual church budget, but it goes beyond that to our spiritually endowed gifts from God as well as our physical church building facilities. It's all apart of taking care of what God has given us for the church's mission in this world and to glorify Jesus. We are being asked to consider our faithfulness to God and the gospel of Jesus Christ. Consider how you can be a better, more faithful servant and steward of God's resources. May God continue to bless FCC so we can faithfully bless the community we are called to serve in Jesus' name.

CWM, THE NEAVES-DAVIS CENTER, AND YOU

The October CWM project is financial support for the Neaves-Davis Center (also known as the D-Home). The Center opened many years ago when a group of citizens (including former FCC member, Nancy Erskine) were concerned that youth in legal trouble were housed in the adult jail; a juvenile center was then built. Funds are used to purchase items such as books for the Center's library, educational games, equipment for the gymnasium, and computer programs. The average age of the 20 children typically in the Center is 15 ½ with an average stay of 17 days. Our monetary donations can help provide positive activities for the teens and expose them to alternate ways to spend their time. This is a program that is often neglected in our community and where we can make a difference.
