CALLED TO BE FAITHFUL

Paul's letter to the Romans chapter 15 asks this church to collect an offering for the people of the mother church in Jerusalem. Disaster had struck Palestine, and the church in Jerusalem was in great need. The daughter churches of Asia Minor had the rich opportunity to give to those who had real need.

I admire the way Paul goaded the rich Corinthian church by telling them how generous the poor Macedonians (the churches in Galatia and Philippi) had already been. 1 Corinthians 16:1–3 (NRSV) "Now concerning the collection for the saints: you should follow the directions I gave to the churches of Galatia. ² On the first day of every week, each of you is to put aside and save whatever extra you earn, so that collections need not be taken when I come. ³ And when I arrive, I will send any whom you approve with letters to take your gift to Jerusalem."

Paul writes a letter to the Macedonia church when he is in prison. These Christians go to great lengths to send tokens of care to Paul in prison. Paul's letter to the Philippians is a thank-you note for the care package that they sent.

The church at Corinth had plenty, more than enough to share. They were wealthy, but they constantly complained. They argued about preachers, they argued about church discipline, they argued about sharing their fellowship dinners with one another. Their lives were a constant whine and a grumble. While the poor Christians of Macedonia gave more than they could afford.

Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 8:1–7 (NRSV) "We want you to know, brothers and sisters, about the grace of God that has been granted to the churches of Macedonia; ² for during a severe ordeal of affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. ³ For, as I can testify, they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means, ⁴ begging us earnestly for the privilege of sharing in this ministry to the saints— ⁵ and this, not merely as we expected; they gave themselves first to the Lord and, by the will of God, to us, ... ⁷ Now as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you—so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking."

Then concluding in 2 Corinthians 9:7, Paul writes, "Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." A better rendering of the Greek word cheerful is "hilarious." God loves hilarious givers. This is the very nature of God—God's giving to us is scandalously generous. It's hilarious that God would give us so much! We don't deserve it. But the abundant gift is an opportunity God wants for us to learn to give with joy and without compulsion.

Remember who the real giver is. Paul is clear—we are not the original givers, as a matter of fact, what we give is merely what we have received. God provides for us so that we may give.

This time of year is a good time for us to consider what our pledge will be for the upcoming year. Ten percent (10%) is a tithe. A tithe is only the beginning. Your gifts are those things that go above and beyond a tithe. So consider where you are in your tithing to the church. There will be some more information about our stewardship campaign coming to you soon.

CWM, THE NEAVES-DAVIS CENTER, AND YOU

The October CWM project is financial support for the Neaves-Davis Center (also known as the D-Home). The Center opened many years ago when a group of citizens (including former FCC member, Nancy Erskine) were concerned that youth in legal trouble were housed in the adult jail; a juvenile center was then built. Funds are used to purchase items such as books for the Center's library, educational games, equipment for the gymnasium, and computer programs. The average age of the 20 children typically in the Center is 15 ½ with an average stay of 17 days. Our monetary donations can help provide positive activities for the teens and expose them to alternate ways to spend their time. This is a program that is often neglected in our community and where we can make a difference.
