WE ARE DISCIPLES OF CHRIST

What we believe is indicated by what we do. As Disciples of Christ what do we believe and do? What do you know about the Disciples if someone were to ask you about your faith and your church?

I was given the following Disciples of Christ advertising published in <u>various</u> newspapers across the country. It explains us very well.

We believe in **Open Communion**. The Lord's Supper is celebrated in weekly worship and it is open to all who believe in Jesus Christ.

We believe in the **Oneness of the Church**. All Christians (women and men) are called to be one in Christ and to seek opportunities for common witness and service.

We believe in **Freedom of Belief.** As Disciples of Christ we are called together around two essentials of faith: a belief in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, and that Christians are free to follow their conscience guided by Bible study, the Holy Spirit, and prayer, and we extend that freedom to others.

We believe in **Baptism by Immersion**. In baptism, the old self-centered life is set aside, washed away and a new life of trust in God begins. Although Disciples practice baptism by immersion, other baptism traditions are honored.

We believe in the **Ministry of Believers**. Both ordained ministers and laity lead in worship, service, and spiritual growth.

And above all we believe that, Jesus Christ is the son of the Living God, who offers saving grace to all.

The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) was founded in the United States in 1832, seeking to move beyond denominational disagreements. Our founders envisioned a united church of Jesus Christ modeled on the New Testament.

I am reminded of an African-American, Disciples of Christ congregation, in Indianapolis, called "Light of the World Christian Church," that begins each Sunday morning worship experience with some statement about our Disciple identity and what it means to be a Disciple of Christ. What a great idea. We need to be reminded, now and then, what we believe and who the Disciples of Christ are in the church universal. We do stand for something.

Dear Women of First Christian DOC,

I am so excited that I will be with you for your Women's Retreat in a few weeks!! I think it will be a wonderful time.

My topic for the day will be "Sacred Space Walking," and I will present material to help us focus on the importance of keeping our spiritual life rich, growing, and vibrant so that we are better equipped to serve in the world and to ultimately transcend the world completely.

I will use Evelyn Underhill's "Concerning the Inner Life." Evelyn Underhill was born in 1875. She was educated at King's College for Women in London where she later became an Honorary Fellow and then a Fellow. She was also an Honorary Doctor of Divinity of the University of Aberdeen. In 1921, she was the Upton Lecturer on the Philosophy of Religion at Manchester College. She was a prolific writer in the area of Christian mysticism. This work, "Concerning the Inner Life," is actually a lecture that she originally delivered to a gathering of priests to encourage them in their spiritual life, but it is full of wisdom that is relevant to us as women in 2017.
