WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The world around us is full of division - liberal vs conservative, women vs men, nation against nation, division across generations and religions. Through news and social media, we are surrounded by polarizing messages that further separate us. Even those of us who love God and follow Jesus are divided by dogma and denominations.

We know God loves all He created and wants us to love each other. So what will God do with today's circumstances? What does He want us to do?

Physicist and theologian John Polkinghorne considers a laser beam and compares it to prayer. In a laser beam, light waves are coherently aligned and are much more powerful than the random light that naturally surrounds us all the time. When we pray, as we talk with God and listen to God, we align with God's will -- individually and collectively. Prayer generates powerful responses from our words and thoughts.

We can pray for unity among all Christians. For more than a century, January 18-25 has been set aside as the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The World Council of Churches has set the 2017 theme of Reconciliation -- The Love of Christ Compels Us (2 Corinthians 5:14-20). "19God was reconciling the world to himself through Christ, by not counting people's sins against them. He has trusted us with this message of reconciliation." CEB To participate in this Week of Prayer, the Southeast Huntsville Ministerial Association is planning a Christian Unity Service on January 22 at All Saints Lutheran Church. Father Phil O'Kennedy from Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church will be the speaker.

As Christians, we can also pray for unity for all of God's creation. The Division of Mission of the Alabama/ NW Florida Disciples of Christ have written topical prayers for each day of the Week of Prayer, from our young people who will be gathered at Camp Chandler that weekend to healthy interfaith dialogue and international peace.

So what can you do? Join in praying for unity. Check out The Journey and your Sunday worship bulletin for details about the community-wide Week of Prayer service. Pick up the printed prayers in the narthex. Look to God, who wants to save us all.
