THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO YOU: COURAGE

I am preaching a Lenten Sermon Series entitled, "The Gospel According to YOU." This Sunday I will be preaching on our witness of Christ in our COURAGE. The sermon text is Matthew 21:1-10, Mark 10:32-34: *The Triumphal Entry* and *Jesus Predicts his Death and Resurrection*.

There is nothing you and I need more than courage. Regardless of our age or circumstances, courage is a necessary ingredient of successful living. Think, if you will, of some of the circumstances when courage is required of us.

It takes courage, for example, to live by one's religious beliefs. Courage is required when one stands up for one's convictions in the face of opposition. It takes courage to admit you were wrong and apologize. It takes courage to accept the loss of a loved one and go on living.

There has never been a time when courage was not needed for worthwhile living. Scripture is filled with the summons to courage.

In the Hebrew scriptures, the Lord encouraged Moses while he was leading the Israelite people across the desert wilderness, saying. "Be strong and of good courage. Do not be afraid or dismayed" (1 Chronicles 22:13).

Centuries later, courage is also what characterized much of Jesus' life and ministry. Whether he was proclaiming his message to the masses, denouncing the hypocrisies of the scribes and Pharisees or throwing the money-changers from the Temple grounds, courage was a hallmark of his ministry.

Throughout his ministry, Jesus lived with great courage. Jesus summoned his disciples to live by that same courage! He said, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). Implicit in that invitation is the reality that every Christian has his/her own cross waiting for them, a cross destined and appointed by God. To live one's life with that awareness requires enormous courage.

This Sunday is Palm/Passion Sunday. We remember Jesus' last week in Jerusalem before his death. From riding into Jerusalem on (Palm) Sunday and sacrificing his life on the cross that (Good) Friday, daily Jesus showed great courage. It is inspiring.
