GREEN CHALICE: A DISCIPLE OF CHRIST CREATION CARE MINISTRY





At our last Alabama Northwest-Florida Regional Board meeting, a resolution presented by the Young Adults asking the Region to become a "Green Chalice" Regional Church was approved. Now the ALNWFL Regional Church is asking each congregation to consider becoming a Green Chalice congregation. Essentially Green Chalice is a partnership ministry of the Disciples Home Missions seeking better eco-friendly stewardship ways and means of caring for all of God's creation.



Becoming a Green Chalice congregation means that the local congregation takes seriously God's call for stewardship of the earth, caring for its resources, and reducing our congregation's carbon footprint. Every little bit helps our environment and can impact the congregation's budget. FCC Huntsville already does many environmentally conscious things, such as recycling our used Sunday bulletins, office paper waste, and ECM kitchen boxes, aluminum cans, etc. We are also looking into new high efficiency lighting possibilities in the sanctuary, installing new energy efficient HVAC units, and other building and grounds updating efforts. But we can do more!

In fact, I would like to form a Green Chalice task force to explore what else we can do for the environment. This "Green Team" would read and sign a *Green Chalice Covenant* provided by our denomination as a guide to our commitment. The next step is to put our commitment into action and make three changes that will move our congregation toward better caring for God's creation.

- Q. What is PayPal?
- A. PayPal is an online service for businesses and non-profits to accept payments/donations online. It's a widely used and safe way for people to send money on the Internet.
- Q. Do I need a PayPal account to donate?
- A. No You can simply enter your payment information on PayPal's secure website and the donation will be sent as a one-time gift to the church. However, if you have a PayPal account, you can simply transfer money to the church through PayPal to giving@fcc-hsv.org
- Q. How does the church get the money I send?
- A. After you complete the payment information steps at PayPal, the funds are immediately deposited in the church's online PayPal account. The bookkeeper will then transfer your donation to the church's bank account.
- Q. Are there any fees or costs to give online?
- A. Not to you. The full amount that you choose to donate goes to First Christian Church and is considered a tax-deductible gift. There is a small fee to the church for the processing of credit and debit cards.
- Q. Is my information safe and confidential?
- A. Yes Online giving is actually less risky than handwritten checks. An online transaction cannot be lost, stolen, or destroyed. PayPal automatically encrypts your confidential information using the Secure Sockets Layer protocol (SSL) with an encryption key length of 128-bits (the highest level commercially available). When you give through PayPal, the church does NOT see private information like your debit card or bank account number.
