CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

There will be a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, June 11, following second service. THE BALLAST OF FAITH

In the old town of San Juan, Puerto Rico, several streets are paved with blue-gray bricks made from the residue of iron furnaces in Spain in the nineteenth century. These were placed in ships as ballast for a stormy trip. When the voyagers arrived in the new land, they no longer needed ballast, but a new need arose. In the rainy season they discovered that it was easy to get mired down in the mud, so the blue-gray stones were used to pave a solid path beneath their feet.

I know in Savannah, Georgia, the cobble stone streets at the waterfront city wharf were rounded river stones originating from England. They were not blue-gray bricks from iron furnaces, but they were ballast stones none-the-less used to balance the ships on the treacherous Atlantic crossing. Once here in America the ships no longer need the ballast stones and they were abandoned in Savannah making room for trade items going back to Europe.

So it is with faith. When our lives slip their moorings and we are tossed about in the stormy sea of hard-ship and trouble, faith deep within us can keep us steady and help us ride out the storm. The ballast of faith gives us balance.

Our faith can also do more than that for us. It may pave the way so we can make better progress and not get bogged down in the things that impede the progress of those who have no faith by which to live. To put Christ at the center is to pave the way of life with faith and to smooth the way with peace and service.

Let us look to God in all things and God will give us the faith by which we can live in today's world. See You in Church,



PENTECOST OFFERING JUNE 4 & 11

"Planting a church can make a huge and lasting impression in the community it serves," says Terrell McTyer, minister of New Church Strategies and former new church planter. "By empowering the oppressed, praying for the disenfranchised, caring for the poor and promoting hope in a fragmented world, the church can literally help change the world," he adds.

Churches Change the World...Start More! is the theme for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) 2017 Pentecost Offering, which will be celebrated Sundays, June 4 and June 11. To date, the Christian Church has started 980 churches in the United States and Canada, sharing the gospel with more than 61,500 individuals since initiating the 2020 Vision in 2000. According to McTyer, the original goal was to start 1,000 new congregations by 2020, and we can't stop there. "We must continue our journey by setting our sights higher, planting even more churches and equipping more courageous leaders," he says.

Each year, half of the Pentecost Offering is designated to your local Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) Region/Area in an effort to start and sustain new churches such as the Hispanic Church that is meeting at FCC Huntsville Sunday evenings. The other half is used by Hope Partnership to support the recruitment, assessment, training and coaching of new church leaders at events like Leadership Academy.
