ON GENUINE CELEBRATION

There is an old story told about a certain cathedral somewhere in Europe. I think the story is based on fact although it may be embellished in telling it over and over again. In the entrance to the cathedral there was a well worn spot on one wall. Those who entered the cathedral to worship stopped at that spot and either touched or kissed the wall.

A stranger visited the cathedral and observed the ritual and was curious. He wondered why nearly everyone who entered went through the same motions at the wall. He asked someone who entered and they thought a moment, then said, "I don't know why. It has been part of our tradition ever since I can remember."

He asked another person who seemed to be older and he thought he might know. The answer was similar, "I came here as a child with my grandparents. They always touched the wall there and taught me to do the same."

The stranger asked another and another and another. None seemed to know the meaning of the rite. Finally he went to the priest, but he didn't know the answer to the mystery either.

The curiosity of the priest was stirred and he called the elderly bishop who had been in the parish many years before his retirement. He also did not know the answer to the question, but said he would investigate and report back to them

After a lengthy search the bishop discovered that in the original building there had been a painting of the Madonna and Christ Child on the wall the worshippers would so reverently touch. There was no record that the painting had ever been removed or painted over so they thought it might still be there. A little soap and water, and a soft cloth was used to wash away the dirt and grime of centuries and the painting was there in all of its loveliness.

The picture had been covered over for years, but the people had continued with the ritual by tradition. None knew what it meant, but they did it out of habit.

Now maybe this is a parable for us as we examine the things that we do by way of habit/ritual. It may be a very special parable for us as we celebrate the Fourth of July. There will be usual patriotic rhetoric, the noise of fireworks, the picnics, the parades, etc. Some of these will be only meaningless tradition. We may do them without remembering the sacrifices made by so many to bring this nation into being and to preserve it across the years.

We need to give some thought to what we do and why we do it on such occasions as the Fourth of July. The day was set aside as a national celebration, a time of remembering. May we not forget the struggle of those who gave this nation its life.
