#### NAME THAT TUNE

Do you remember that TV Game Show of yesterday (and I mean a long time ago) entitled, "Name That Tune?" "Yes! I can name that tune in 6 notes!" And the bidding goes on with who can name the tune in less notes.

Let's put a new twist on that old show. In our game, there is no 'bidding' for the opportunity to guess the song titles, based upon the cue given by the show's host and upon your ability to select the appropriate song title from listening to fewer melodic notes than your opponent. For our game, carefully read the selected portions from 3 actual letters written to church leadership. Without cheating (i.e. don't look at the answers somewhere below), then guess what songs in which the writer makes reference. Be careful! You may be surprised! (Answers at end of article.)

- 1. "What's wrong with the inspiring hymns with which we grew up? When I go to church, it is to worship God, not to be distracted with learning a new hymn. Last Sunday's was particularly unnerving. While the text was good, the tune was discordant."
- 2. "Was it the organist's idea or yours that our peaceful worship service was shattered by the new hymn last Sunday? The music was sacrilegious; something one would expect to hear in a den of iniquity, not a church! Don't expect me even to attempt to sing it next time!"

3. "Pastor, I'm no music scholar, but I feel I know appropriate music when I hear it. Last Sunday's new hymn, if you could call it that, sounded like a sentimental love ballad one might hear crooned in a saloon. If you persist in exposing us to rubbish like this in God's house, don't be surprised if many of the faithful look for a new place to worship. The hymns we grew up with are all that we need."

The above article was given to me by a blessed, elderly, highly respected church organist, pianist, musician many years ago and she thought it to be funny. "Imagine someone writing that to church leadership," she said. Then she would say quite often, "Remember every song, no matter how old, was new once."

Personally my faith and worship of God, even my fellowship with others around me at church, is not threatened by leaning new praise songs during worship. I like to learn new things. It truly enriches my life to hear the Good News of Jesus for the "first time" all over again, in new and inspiring ways.

#### **NEW GENERAL MINISTER AND PRESIDENT ELECTED**

Rev. Teresa "Terri"
Hord Owens was elected
Sunday night to serve as
the General Minister
and President of the
Christian Church
(Disciples of Christ) in
the United States and
Canada. She is the first
African-American to
hold this post and the
second woman to lead
the denomination.



Hord Owens comes to the position in a time of renewed emphasis on the issues of race, particularly in the United States. Her election comes on the 50th anniversary of the Merger Agreement uniting the African-American and largely white branches of the American-born denomination. She is currently pastor of a predominately white congregation in the Chicago area.

"We need to stop demonizing differences as deficiencies," Hord Owens says. "We should seek to understand, to work through our differences in priorities, opinions, methods, and goals. This will not be easy, but imagine what an example this will be for the world if we can bridge the gaps in politics, identity, geography and theology."

Hord Owens' resume includes more than 20 years in corporate America leading diverse teams in data management before she entered seminary. For the last 15 years, she has been the dean of students at the University of Chicago Divinity School, shepherding a varied student body in both background and theology.

The election of Hord Owens follows the 12-year tenure of the Rev. Sharon E. Watkins, who was the first female to lead a mainline denomination in the United States upon her election in 2005. Hord Owens' term is six years with an option for re-election in 2023 for an additional six-year term.

The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) was born out of the Stone-Campbell Movement, part of the Great Awakening on the American frontier in the early 1800s. The denomination is congregationally governed, meaning each congregation appoints its own leadership and determines its own mission and support. There are 32 regional bodies that support congregations as well as relate to the general ministries of the denomination.
