First Christian Church offers to children ages 3 through 7 a special place apart from the worshipping congregation to enable the children to become able to worship meaningfully with the congregation.

In the special Children Worship & Wonder (CW&W) sanctuary, FCC offers a worship context for telling and working with biblical stories. The intent of CW&W worship is to experience and praise God. The CW&W sanctuary transforms ordinary time and space into sacred time and space allowing the children to experience and praise God. CW&W offers a context that meets the needs of the young child. Children do love and worship God, and CW&W introduces the meaning and action of corporate worship to the child in a friendly space. [from introduction to Young Children and Worship]

The storytellers and greeters of CW&W hope to create an environment that enables the young child to encounter and worship God. CW&W has been a program to children of FCC since 2005. Through the years, storytellers and greeters have been lost. The program needs new storytellers and greeters. Greeter training will be done in September.
