TAKING THE RIDE

Time is a precious commodity in our household. There is always something going on, a meeting to attend, a practice to go to, homework to be done, laundry to be sorted, not to mention all the surprises. Like most families we try to prioritize the things that are important to us, which means that sometimes we have to say no, or at least not right now, to activities in which we want to participate. We also find ourselves engaging in activities that we never expected to do.

Zip-lining is one such activity. A couple of summers ago we took a few days of vacation before General Assembly as a family. We let the kids choose one thing that they wanted to do, within reason. Joe decided he wanted to go to an amusement park, but Abby told us she wanted to go Zip-lining. If you have never heard of this, basically you climb a tower, are strapped to a steel cable with a pulley, and then sent hurtling out into space, sliding down the cable until you reach the end. One of the rides we went on was over 100 feet in the air, ¼ of a mile long, and the guide said I was going well over 40 miles an hour when he hit the brake.

I loved it, Abby had a blast, Joe enjoyed it, but Patti was terrified. She had to psyche herself up every time she climbed a tower. When I asked her why she was doing this she said, "It is for the kids!" and that was true, but I also believe that Patti went zip-lining to overcome her fear of heights and falling. She had to trust her guide to prepare her pulley, use the brake to slow her down, and keep her safe. I know how terrified she was but she went down every zip-line. She was amazing.

There are many things in life that terrify us. Some things we should be scared of, but other fears are only in our minds. Often we become so obsessed with what might happen that we convince ourselves to never take a risk, to stay with what is comfortable or safe, and let the world pass us by. If we never try to confront our fears, or look beyond them, we limit ourselves and let our fear control us. Patti loved the first zip-lining experience so much we went again and it was great, especially because she enjoyed the experience. She did not look terrified, she looked exhilarated. Again, she amazed me.

First Christian Church has undergone a great deal of change in the last few years and for many this can be terrifying. Yet, the church has always moved forward in the face of difficulty because we worked together and sought God's will for our congregation, not our own. We have already made several courageous decisions, not the least of which is sharing space with another congregation and renovating our existing structure. I am amazed and humbled by the faith of our congregation. Together we will walk out into the unknown, let our great Guide prepare us, and then wait for the ride. I guarantee you, it will be worth it.

MONETARY FUNDING FOR GRATEFUL LIFE

Even the very best monetary planning and budgeting can have major upsets for all of us. Grateful Life has had three events in the last two months that have caused an extreme financial shortage. The GL van used to transport the disadvantaged to and from church needed two new tires and other repairs costing over a thousand dollars. Another major expensive event was a problem with the freezer when it was discovered the door had not been properly secured and the freezer of meat was defrosting. One of the GL volunteers spent a day trying to salvage 60 lb. of meat by cooking all day.

Manna House shares any extras they receive with groups such as Grateful Life. The last few months, Manna House has not had any extra protein to provide to others outside their own needs. Grateful Life needs to purchase meat that normally was acquired through Manna House. This has caused another major expense.
