Invite someone to your meal, provide canned goods or give to Sack Sunday, sponsor a needy family for the holidays, give so that others might experience your joy, and remember that love was born on Christmas, a love that is nurtured in our hearts and shared by our words and actions.

May the love of God enfold you, the blessings of Jesus Christ flow down upon you, and the encouragement of the Holy Spirit give you strength so that the season ahead will be filled with wonder and joy. Thanks be to God, Amen.
