#### **SEEKING A 2020 VISION**

It is strange to think that by the time you read this newsletter article it will be the year 2020. I can remember when this year seemed to be a dream. Several Science Fiction movies are set in the year 2020, it used to be a benchmark for the future, now it is a reality.

In much the same way it seems as if Christmas was just a few days ago and now we are beginning the season of Epiphany and looking ahead to Lent. During Epiphany, we are celebrating the manifestation of God to the world and studying what we know about the early life of Jesus. However, this time is also a reminder of our own journey with Christ, how our decision to be a Christian has changed our lives and caused us to grow and develop into the people God wants us to be.

This is not just something we do as individuals; this should be a community exercise as well. Our congregation needs to take the time to reestablish our priorities, set goals, and seek out what God wants us to be and what we are called to do in our community and the world. In essence, we are seeking vision and direction from God so that we can better serve others.

We should begin this process by returning to our mission statement: *Through Jesus Christ, we come to know real connection with God, with each other and with the world.* 

In order to put this statement into action, we need to accept this mission and develop ways to meet our goals. We must ask ourselves, does First Christian Church provide education, fellowship, worship, and other events that allow us to more fully connect to God? What are we doing to serve our community and the world? Are we sharing the good news of Christ in all that we do?

In the next few weeks we will begin a new Evangelism program, during the Sunday School hour, which will focus on training our members to reach out to our community. This will be a 10-week course beginning on January 19th. The class materials will be based on a book and video lesson series by Sam Chan called *Evangelism in a Skeptical World* and is full of specific ways and methods to draw on. There will also be plenty of time for questions and discussion, focusing on implementing the ideas presented in the session. It is my hope that in this New Year we will realize that God has plans for our congregation. By attending this class, focusing on our mission statement, and seeing the vision God has for our congregation we are actively seeking to fulfill our purpose by spreading the mission and message of Jesus Christ.
