THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH (DISCIPLES OF CHRIST) FAMILY

My family is spread throughout the country. My Uncle and his family live in Muskegon, Michigan. One of my Aunts lives in Manhattan, New York, and the other lives in Winterville, North Carolina. My brother lives in Wichita, Kansas, with his family, my wife's family all live in Kansas, and I have cousins in North Carolina, Illinois, and Indiana. Therefore, it is always special when my relatives can get together for a family reunion.

Last Thanksgiving Patti, the kids and I were able to visit most of my family, on my mother's side. It was wonderful to see everyone again, hear about their exploits, celebrate my Uncle and Aunt's wedding anniversary, play with my cousins, and remember those who could not make the trip and those who are no longer with us. Yet, throughout it all the connection remains because we are united by ties that cannot be broken.

But ours is a family that is called to grow. It is often said that the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the best kept secret within the denominations of America. Our focus on ecumenism, reconciliation, hospitality, and personal education make for an interesting mix of ideologies and theologies. However, being the best kept secret is not a compliment. It means that those who are not associated with our denomination know nothing about us. If we are truly to be the family of God this must change.

One of our former General Minister and Presidents, Rev. William Chris Hobgood, writes "As different as we may be, as Disciples we share the most important thing - our belief in God and our confession of faith in Jesus Christ." He suggests that Disciples have five covenantal values that define us as a denomination. These five values are:

- 1) The confession of faith in Jesus Christ as Savior.
- 2) The hospitality of the Lord's Supper.
- 3) The call to ministry for all believers.
- 4) The love of unity.
- 5) The justice of God that orders all our actions.

These values should guide our lives and should be shared.

How do you live out these five Disciple values in your life? How do you build the family of God each day? How can we make sure that the world's people are fed, cared for, rested and happy? As we continue through the season after Epiphany let us reflect on these questions and work to build the heavenly Kingdom together. Amen.
