WHEN LOVE TRANSFORMS US

A few years ago at a leadership retreat, the Rev. Danny Ginn, from Oxford Christian Church in Kansas, spoke about the struggle to do God's will in our lives. Rev. Ginn reminded the participants that letting God become the focus of our lives is difficult because we are all ego driven. What we want, what other people think, and the image society tells us to conform too, have great influence and it is hard to continue the process that is necessary for transformation. God prevails in this struggle through unconditional love, acceptance, and humbling grace.

In the gospel of John Chapter 15 Jesus told the disciples that, "You did not choose me but I choose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name." This powerful statement reminds us that everything we have, everything we are, and everything we will be belongs to God. We are chosen to bear the fruit, the good news of Jesus Christ, to the ends of the earth and when we look beyond ourselves for our purpose we find that this is our mission.

Individuals and congregations often shy away from this struggle because they perceive change as a threat and a personal loss. When new ideas and new understandings of the church come into focus do we celebrate, or mourn a perceived loss of control and identity within the church? This loss is threatening to the comfortable nature of our community and so we distance ourselves from new ideas until they fade away.

In this season of Epiphany we must remember that central to the life and message of Christ is the love and acceptance of God. Since we are created in the image of God and are called to pattern our lives on Jesus, he becomes our model of love. Christ's love was open, full of forgiveness and the hope of repentance and so we must model these traits. When we do we will find that the good news not only spreads through the world but it spreads throughout our being filling us with the love, peace and hope of God. Amen.
