LEAST OF THESE

More than 25 years ago, the Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat."

This week our youth ministry will begin its community outreach by collecting can goods, cash, check or grocery gift cards to help support our sister church Grateful Life. On average, Grateful Life services the needs of nearly 100 homeless people on any given Sunday. Pastor Sheri and her staff ensure that those in need have food, toiletries, clothing, medicine and a warm place to sleep in the cold months.

When I reflect on the gospel of Matthew, I am reminded that ministry is never about me but rather God's people, all people even the least of these. As we read Matthew's gospel we come to understand the earthly life and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Matthew's book emphasizes Jesus' teaching for the church's internal life as well as its evangelistic mission.

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me" (Matthew 25:35-36).

This parable is a reminder that as the body of Christ we are to love others. Jesus continues to say "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). Can you imagine if we all fully lived out Jesus' teachings just how much this world could fully be transformed? I challenge you all to this.

As one body, let's take the time now through February 4th to give to the least of these and show love, compassion and support for Grateful Life by donating can goods, money, checks or grocery gift cards. Amen.
