THE WORK OF LOVE

It is that time of year again when red and pink cards with hearts and cupids show up on the aisles of stores and you can find chocolates and flowers everywhere. Valentine's Day is named after Saint Valentine, a Catholic priest who lived in Rome in the 3rd Century. At the time of Valentine's life, many Romans were converting to Christianity, but the Emperor Claudius II was not a believer and created strict laws about what Christians were allowed to do. Claudius believed that Roman soldiers should be completely devoted to Rome and therefore passed a law preventing them from marrying. St. Valentine began to marry these soldiers in secret Christian ceremonies and this was the beginning of his reputation for believing in the importance of love.

Eventually, Valentine's acts were discovered and he was put in prison. While imprisoned, Valentine cared for his fellow prisoners and his jailor's blind daughter. Legend has it that Valentine cured the girl's blindness and that his final act before being executed was to write her a love message signed 'from your Valentine'. Valentine was executed on February 14th in the year 270, but it was not until more than 200 years later that February 14th was proclaimed St. Valentine's Day.

Like many Christian holidays, Valentine's Day has become more secular and is now associated with romantic love, with around one billion cards being exchanged and thirty six million heart shaped boxes of candy sold each year. While I am not adverse to a holiday that focuses on the ideal of love it is important to know that Christian love should be viewed much differently. Christian love is not just an emotion; it is the actions that spring from that emotion.

In First Corinthians chapter 13 we read that, "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends."

The modern view of love is portrayed in the media as love at first sight, passions that inflame the soul, and desire that overcomes reason. For Paul, love was less of a feeling and more of a way to live and act in the world. He reminds us that we could be empowered with all spiritual gifts, have faith that could change the world, understand the mysteries of the universe, and give away all that we own, but if these things are performed for the wrong reasons, if they are not done in a spirit of love, then they amount to nothing. For Paul, all good things are worthless if they are not done in the spirit of love.

For Paul love is the model for Christian life, how we are to treat others in our family of faith and in the world. He believed that if you cooked Christianity down to its essence, boiled away all of the other concerns, you would find one thing that remains. What remains is not a doctrine, a set of rules, a creed or a confession. When you take our faith to its core, what remains is love.

Yes, Valentine's Day is coming, and it should be celebrated. We need to spend time with the people we care about and deepen our relationships. Yet, let us also move into the world and love others as God loves us. Let us share this powerful and life-changing love that takes work, but is well worth the effort.
