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2018 MUSIC DIRECTOR SEARCH

During last week's Sunday services, Pastor Paul made the joyous announcement that Lauren Carter and Christopher McDonald have been promoted to Co-Directors of Music. I'd like to share with you how this decision has come about.

As you know, our Director of Music position has been vacant for many months...and for much of that time we have been blessed with Michael Beutjer taking those responsibilities on a volunteer basis. The congregation was also waiting until a new senior minister was named, before beginning the search for a new music director.

In mid-December, I was asked to lead the search for a new music director. It has been a few years since FCC has had an active music committee, and now that we have reestablished that group, we are able to bring several diverse perspectives to oversee our congregation's music efforts. We spent the past two months evaluating the musical needs of the congregation, and crafting a new job description for the music director that represents our needs as the congregation stands today. This involved weekly meetings of the five members of the committee, along with our personnel committee chair, the board moderator, and Pastor Paul.

While this process was going on, and without a music director, our two accompanists, Chris and Lauren, out of necessity, increased their time commitment to the church, sharing the duties of the music director. Those efforts have seen good results, with a broad focus on blended musical offerings, growth in the number of music participants, and a quality of music that the congregation is responding positively to.

Once the new position description was approved, Chris and Lauren came to the music committee with a proposal to share the music director's responsibilities and co-direct the church's music offerings, based on the current operating system that they've had in place since the Christmas season. On Sunday, February 25, the committee met with them and we agreed that rather than posting the position and interviewing candidates, our current structure was the best option to continue our current momentum.

We've all witnessed how well these two very talented musicians work together, and we are very pleased with the path that they have set for our future. The music committee will continue to meet with Lauren and Chris on a regular basis, to help them plan for the months ahead and give them whatever support is needed.

I'd like to thank the members of the committee for their efforts: Holly Ahlbin, Elaine French, Gayle Herber and Becky Lash, as well as Mack Blackman from the personnel committee, Moderator Beverly Cannon, and Pastor Paul.
