SPRING AND NEW LIFE

It is strange to think that only a few weeks ago we were still wearing our winter coats and the sun was going down before we sat down to supper. Now flowers are blooming, the birds have returned, and the trees are starting to bud. Spring is not around the corner, Spring is already here. In the church when we think of Spring we think of Easter and the renewal that it brings, however we are still in the season of Lent, reflecting on our lives and bringing before God our sin and brokenness. This time of contemplation is leading us to the ideals of transformation and rebirth found in Easter. In our Sunday morning worship services, even though the alter is draped in black, the candles are missing, and the cross is hidden, there is still a joyful spirit because we know that soon our time of mourning will be over and our faith will be renewed.

April 14th is Palm/Passion Sunday, and opportunity to celebrate the crowds cheering for Jesus as he entered Jerusalem, but also a time when we look ahead to his last week on earth and the cross looming in the distance. It is easy to allow the joy of resurrection to overshadow the sacrifice of the cross but you cannot have one without the other, there can be no faith without sacrifice.

Our Lenten services are opportunities to contemplate Jesus' journey to the cross and to worship together as a community. They begin with Palm Sunday but do not forget our Maundy Thursday service, on April 18th at 7:00 pm. This year the First Christian Church choir will be presenting a Tenebrae service. The word "Tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning "darkness." The Tenebrae is an ancient Christian service that makes use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles to symbolize the events of that week from the triumphant Palm Sunday entry through Jesus' burial. This increasing darkness symbolizes Jesus' death and our hopelessness in the world without God. We will also hold a communion service, a reminder of Jesus' presence with us even in the midst of pain and loss. The worshipers will then leave in silence to ponder the impact of Christ's death and await the coming Resurrection.

All of these events either help us to prepare or realize the significance of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross and his resurrection for the sake of the world. Such a gift is not to be taken lightly, but treasured and allowed to nourish our souls so that through our words and our lives others may see the love of God revealed. This year let us all experience the joy and renewal that Easter brings. Amen.
