#### THE WORK OF MINISTRY

I can still remember the year that I left Seminary and traveled to North Carolina to serve my first church. I had already been the pastor of a church in Chaplin, Kentucky, but I was a part time pastor and a full time student. First Christian Church in Chaplin was a very small congregation, but it helped me grow and taught some very important lessons. First Christian Church in Farmville was much larger and had been through some turmoil. I knew where I was moving, I was born fifteen minutes away, went to college in the area, and my family was from the town I would be serving, so I was not a stranger, but it would be different, something new, something challenging, and I have to admit that I was terrified.

What if the church was not a good fit for me, what if the church was not a good fit for Patti? Was I ready for a full time pastorate, maybe I should start with an associate pastor's position? How would I balance family life with the life of a minister? Could we find some place to live so we could move out of AC Turnage's guest room? Is this where God wanted me to be?

All of these questions kept swirling through my mind the first few weeks I was there, until it happened. One Sunday I arrived at the church, went into my office, began to prepare for the worship service and someone came in to ask the minister a question, and I realized that was me. I was no longer in school, although I knew that I would continue to learn about my vocation, I was actively participating in the work of ministry, I was the spiritual leader of a congregation, I was the person that people came to for wisdom and advice. That was a lot to think about but that day I began to understand the joy and the heartbreak that ministry can bring. I was a part of a community of faith, I was called to lead and I had to take up this challenge.

We are all called to lead in our own way. One of the foundational elements of our denomination is the priesthood of all believers, or the idea that we are all called to ministry and service. We all have different gifts, but these spiritual gifts are to be used to support the work of the church and the mission of Christ in the world. In this way we are all called to leadership and we are all challenged to move our congregation forward. How can we serve our members and the community better? How can we reach out to the lost, the hurting and the hungry? How can we become the church God wants us to be? These are all questions that can challenge us, but they also provide new life and purpose on our journey of faith. Together, let us take up the mantle of ministry and proclaim the living Christ, Amen.


