However, God has a purpose for our congregation and we must seek this vision and make it our own to continue to be faithful to our call to ministry. As we grow and develop as a community of faith we will look back to this time as a milestone for our church and for the world, and then look ahead to the next, so we can continue to move forward in faith.
