### **ABIDE IN ME**

As many of you know Rev. Laura West and I will be attending the 2019 General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), in Des Moines, Iowa. The General Assembly is a biennial gathering of representatives from the General Church, Regions and individual congregations that meet to share ideas, enjoy fellowship, and undertake the business of the church. The Assembly also provides opportunities for worship, Bible studies, workshops, mission projects, and other events that transform lives and encourage the work of ministry.

The theme for the 2019 General Assembly is "Abide in Me" based on John 15: 1-5...

<sup>"1</sup>'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. <sup>2</sup>He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. <sup>3</sup>You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. <sup>4</sup>Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. <sup>5</sup>I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing."

(New Revised Standard Version)

Rev. Dr. Cynthia Linder, from the University of Chicago Divinity School writes..." Perhaps, then, it should come as no surprise that in the midst of dinner on one of the darkest nights of their lives—on the eve of his betrayal, trial, and crucifixion— Jesus reminds his disciples that they would do well to take a lesson from our verdant partners in creation. When Jesus meets their present crisis by invoking the example of the vines that have delighted and daunted us for generations, he was offering so much more than poetic platitudes or the cheap assurance that all would be well, by and by. Jesus wasn't soothing his friends with promises of better days, nor coaching them to cling to the memories of happier times past: in fact, he rejects these familiar refuges of fair-weather faith. Instead, Jesus meets his friends' fear of abandonment and failure with a sturdy assertion of God's power and their own: "Abide in me as I abide in you."

So often when we speak of our denomination, or of Christianity as a whole, our words are fearful of what the future will hold. We look at the falling statistical numbers of those who state they are Christian in our culture, the disintegration of existing denominations, the distrust of clergy, and the general feeling of apathy in our nation; and there seems to be little hope to hold on to.

Jesus reminds us that when we are separated from one another we can do nothing, but when we join together, as a vine with branches, we can bear fruit that will nourish not only our community but the world. When Jesus calls us to "Abide in me" he also tells us that he lives and breathes within each of us. We are never alone, lost or abandoned; Jesus remains because he is a part of who we are. This idea comforts us, but we can't stop there. Jesus also calls us— giving strength for the work we have ahead to place joy in our lives, love at our table, heart in our whole-ness and feet to our movement.

Please pray for the success of the 2019 General Assembly and the safety of all who travel to Des Moines, but most importantly, pray that God will give our denomination the strength to fulfill our vision for the future as we strive to become the church that God wants us to be. Amen.
