WHEN DO WE OPEN AGAIN?

Whenever I host a meeting on Zoom, call someone on the phone, attend a church meeting or talk to someone (from a safe distance) in person, one question is always asked, when is the church going to reopen? That is a difficult question to answer. Some would say that the church never closed, we are still working, we are still hosting online services, meetings continue, money is collected, and mission work is done. The only difference seems to be that we are doing most of these items from home.

However, I know what people are truly asking, "When are things going to get back to normal? When will we be able to meet face to face, in the sanctuary, have a cup of coffee before the worship and then sing and praise God together?" In Alabama, churches are now allowed to reopen, while following safety precautions, but most congregations have chosen not to meet. The Southeast Area Ministerial Association in Huntsville met last week and all agreed that it was too soon to begin in-person worship services, but that when we do choose to meet, we would have to work together to make sure that the safety of our parishioners and the community around us is paramount.

In April, the White House and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued guidelines for reopening the country that focused on "gating" criteria for three "phases" of returning to normal. As per the CDC guidelines, older people, or those with another risk factor, are "strongly encouraged" to continue to stay home. However, our response to a pandemic is, inevitably, about much more than epidemiology or economics. It's about morality. If we're honest, we're being asked to open up more than workplaces or churches. We have been asked to have a conversation about acceptable risk versus the freedom to choose.

While we figure out what, when, and how to open, we should take the opportunity to address this moral challenge directly. Will we become energized by the thought that we truly are in this together or will we let our own desires rule us? We all have to work hard to watch out for information that confirms our biases, and to check for different perspectives before assuming that a course of action is helpful, useful, or risky.

Earlier this week I posted a Facebook Article that asked the church not to let COVID-19 divide us. Yes, we may have different ideas on what needs to happen, if we should open now or later, if we should wear masks, or if we should stay home or continue to go out. However, at church we should always look for the ways we can make others feel welcomed. Yes, wearing a mask in inconvenient, but if it makes our church members feel safe, we can wear them for an hour or two. Yes, the virus will change the way we worship for a time, but if it allows others to feel safe, we can worship in a new way for a few weeks or months. Above all, we should support one another during this time so we are all empowered to share the love of God with the world.
