Taking this time to get away from the world and focus on your life of faith can be challenging. It takes effort to prepare, study, and learn. When you arrive at camp it takes time to build community and learn to trust one another. Usually Wednesday is that magic day for camp, when things just seem to come together. When this happens we find a sense of peace and purpose that is often missing in our lives. Getting away from the everyday helps us to look back and realize that God has blessed us and has a plan for us.

In the next few weeks First Christian Church will see a great deal of change and we will need to learn to be flexible. Vacation Bible School is next week and we will soon attend our trainings, begin decorating our rooms, and readying our church for an event that welcomes children throughout our community. This is another week of hard work that is very satisfying when you hear the kids singing VBS songs and telling the stories they heard from the Bible to their friends.

In the next few weeks we will also begin our Sanctuary and Narthex renovation project which means our worship service will be moving to McMains Hall. We already have a plan to make this move and hopefully we will be able to overcome some of the challenges we know we will face, but I ask for patience and good humor as we work out the bugs and hold our worship service in a different location.

It is my hope that these events and changes will lead to a sense of excitement and that we will keep that feeling throughout the summer and beyond. Let's build on the joy that these changes can bring, continue to invite new people to experience the presence of Christ in our community, and thank God for what is right in front of us, a wonderful church family that has a vision for the future and continues to work for the glory of God.
