FUN WITH OUR YOUTH AND CHILDREN

The past two weeks have taken me out of my comfort zone, but in a good way. Two weeks ago I traveled with the youth group and several adults from our congregation to Black Mountain, North Carolina to participate in a Mission Trip sponsored by Christmount, our national campground for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Every year they invite youth groups from all over the country to join with the Ashville Youth Mission team, who works with a network of care groups in the Ashville, North Carolina area to provide mission stations for young people who want to serve.

This year our group worked at The MANNA Food bank, a private, not-for-profit service organization that links the food industry with over 200 partner agencies in 16 counties of western North Carolina. MANNA is an acronym and stands for Mountain Area Nutritional Needs Alliance. We also worked at several local sites for food pickup, including a free farmer's market, and the Veteran's Restoration Quarters, a comprehensive residential program that addresses every area of restoration in the lives of homeless veterans including shelter, meals, job training, alcohol and drug rehabilitation etc. Our youth worked very hard at all of these organizations and also talked to those they were serving to build relationships and connect with them. The staff at Christmount and at the Ashville Youth Mission were so appreciative and impressed by the work that was done that we have a standing invitation to come back and help them again.

This past week I was the storyteller for our Vacation Bible School, *Shipwrecked: Rescued by Jesus*. It was wonderful to see all of the young people from ECM, our church and the community who came to learn about their relationship with Christ for a whole week. They were able to sing, play, create some wonderful crafts and every day they heard a new story from the Bible about how Jesus rescues us from loneliness, worry, struggles, when we do wrong (or sin), and powerlessness. On Sunday July 22nd we heard from our children, youth and teachers about how special last week was and how their lives were changed by the experiences they had. I hope you were able to attend.

It is my hope that our mission trip will become an annual event for our youth just as Vacation Bible School is for our children. The Christian Education Committee and the Youth leaders and volunteers have worked very hard to make all of these events possible. Please thank everyone who participated and remember that the Children and Youth Group of First Christian Church appreciates the support that you give to each and every one of their events throughout the year.

Visitor Cakes (Makes 5 mini-loaves)

1 box butter or yellow cake mix

1 sm. instant chocolate pudding mix

4 eggs

1 c. oil

8 oz. sour cream

1 c. mini-chocolate chips

Mix first five ingredients well. Stir in mini chocolate chips. Pour into 5 lightly sprayed disposable aluminum mini loaf pans. Bake 30-35 minutes on a cookie sheet at 350 degrees. Cool completely. Double wrap in plastic wrap and tape the ends. Freeze well.
