When I was growing up in North Carolina my family and I traveled to Atlantic Beach every year for a little fun, rest, and renewal. The beach is one of my favorite places. It is an opportunity to get away for a while and do what I love. I always enjoyed our visits because I got to swim in the surf, fish, read, and play in the sand. As I grew older I was able to spend time alone on the beach, sometimes praying, but often being silent, seeing, searching and listening to what was happening around me.

I remember one afternoon standing in the water and watching the waves as they broke on the shore. The waves were the largest I had seen throughout the week, some reaching far to the shoreline past the belt of broken seashells and onto the dry sand. Yet, often the waves behind them got caught in the ebb of the first wave robbing them of their power. I also saw smaller waves who seemed to flow in layers. By them-selves, these waves did not have much power but when they combined with other waves moving from different directions, some were powerful enough to lift me off my feet.

However, like the power of the sea the church remains constant, always present, and full of surprises. The key is reminding ourselves that we are called to work with each other, build our ministries, and open ourselves to the power of God. By doing this our strength is magnified and the work that we do reaches people and changes lives.

Choir, youth groups, bible studies and other activities will begin meeting again, refreshed after the summer break, but ready to continue their mission of education and community building. All this shows us that we should celebrate the fact that God has blessed First Christian Church with the passion to reach beyond ourselves and make a difference in the world around us. That is something that should lift all of us off our feet in thanksgiving. Amen.
