THE BLESSING OF BREAD

I have always found the process of baking bread fascinating. My father used to bake bread and we would use it in his churches, and later in my mother's church, during communion. I can still see my father in the kitchen, hands covered in flour, mixing the ingredients, kneading the dough, and forming the loaves. What I liked the most about my father making bread, other than eating it, was the smell that filled the entire house. It permeated everything, filling your senses, and letting you know that something wonderful was happening thanks to simple kitchen chemistry.

Bread is simple but it is nourishing. It is easy to make but difficult to master. When done correctly is has wonderful results but if a step is missed or if something goes wrong it can be a disaster. Is it any wonder that Jesus uses bread often as an allegory for the love of God. From the parable of the woman making bread, the use of bread to feed the multitude, eating bread and fish after the resurrection, or breaking bread at the Last Supper, Jesus takes a common staple that would be on any table, and uses it to express the good news he came to share. This is my body broken for you. Take and eat, do this in remembrance of me.

However, bread that is left out to long will go stale, and eventually it will mold and begin to rot. Bread was meant to be used and to be shared. In the same way the blessings we receive from God can so stale if they are not used. Like the parable of the woman making bread, when we use our blessings we will find that they are returned, maybe not in the way that we gave them, but in relationships, service, good will, and acts of justice. When this happens, the Spirit of God fills the room, like the wonderful scent of bread baking, filling us with joy and hope for the future.

Just as Jesus used bread to share his message of hope and peace with others let us use this time to reconcile with our neighbor, open our heart to the stranger, and continue the process of transformation that we began when we accepted Christ into our hearts, minds, and lives. I hope you will join us as we worship online or in our drive in services as we accept our great commission to spread the good news throughout the world. Grace and peace to you all, Amen.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH IN AUGUST

Our focus in August is Morris Elementary/Middle School, a Title 1 school. To prepare for the students' return to classrooms after the first 9 weeks of remote learning, Morris has specifically asked for disinfectant wipes, disinfectant spray, hand sanitizer, facial tissue, disposable face masks, and re-useable (not disposable) water bottles instead of the usual variety of school and hygiene supplies.

Some days they change me for the better, like the beautiful loaf of whole wheat bread I made for my family this week. Sometimes they change me for the worse, and I feel spread out on the pan of life like a dough that did not come together. Today, may I choose the yeast that makes me better.
