#### **MOUNTAINTOP EXPERIENCES**

At many of the retreats I have attended the participants had an opportunity to share how they experienced God in the church; times when they felt close to God and received a sense of direction, purpose and a renewed commitment to faith. Often these are called mountaintop experiences. Throughout the Scriptures mountaintop experiences are times of transformation. In Exodus, when Moses left the mountain after being in God's presence, he brought a new way of living to his people. When Jesus was transfigured on the mountaintop it signaled the beginning of a new phase of his ministry, one that ultimately led to crucifixion and resurrection.

The thing to remember about mountaintop experiences is that while they are wonderful there is always the need to go back into the valley again. If Moses had stayed on the mountain his people would have perished in the wilderness. If Jesus had stayed on the mountain, like Peter suggested, then his ministry would have been incomplete. When we hear the call of God, when our lives are changed by the presence of our Creator, we must go into the world sharing our vision and ministering to others.

In the past few weeks at First Christian Church, we have had several mountaintop experiences. On the last Sunday in August we promoted our children and youth to their new Sunday School and evening activities. The week before we celebrated our new Youth Director. Last Wednesday we began our Wednesday Night Suppers as well as the Bible Studies, groups for all ages and our Church Choir after a summer break. In the coming weeks we will begin our Children's Choir, hold a Choir Retreat, host a blood drive, and soon we will celebrate the renovation of our Sanctuary, we have a lot going on!

Now we need to take our excitement with us and share it with others. Invite your friends and neighbors to a Wednesday Night Dinner or a special event. Share information about our children's programs to coworkers and family members. Invite everyone to choir practice, and our Children's Choir. If you have youth in 6th to 12th grade invite them to our youth programs to see Alyssa, our new Youth Director, in action. God has provided the mountaintop experiences. Now it is up to us to be transformed, share our excitement, and spread the good news in our community and to the ends of the earth. Amen.
