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TRYING SOMETHING NEW

September is often a time of evaluation and assessment for churches. While new programs begin we also begin to look at the coming year and evaluate our current scheduled events to see what is working, what needs to be renewed, and what needs to end. We know that there is a time and a season for everything, and that all things have a life span. Sometimes room needs to be made for new ideas that will encourage physical and spiritual growth.

Evaluation and assessment are important tools for the church and they are just as important for individuals. We will open the doors to the Family Services room and ask that you enter there, so we can keep track of who is attending. We also ask that you inform the church office by Monday if you are going to attend the Wednesday meal, you can also sign up to be a part of the meal every week.

I hope that in this time of reflection and evaluation you will pen your hearts to God and see where the Spirit leads you. Try something new, if not coming to supper perhaps a new Bible study, a new spiritual discipline, or a new way of serving others in the community. In doing so you will be refreshed, renewed, and ready to continue Christ's mission wherever that may lead. Thanks be to God, Amen.
