JUMP INTO MINISTRY

One of the things that we loved about our home in Manhattan Kansas was that it had a small in ground pool in the backyard. I can remember there was nothing like a dip in the pool after you mow your grass on a hot August day. However, it was always around this time of year that we had to close the pool. Even if during the day the temperatures were warm it was the temperatures at night that made the pool unpleasant. I can still remember going to the pool, dipping my foot in and tensing up at the unexpected temperature. There was no way I was getting in.

On the other hand Abby and Joe just jumped right in. Of course, when they came up for air they would yell, "It's cold!" and often would jump right out. However, sometimes, when they stayed in the water, and as they played and had fun, they would get used to the temperature, only to be reminded of it again when they exited the pool and shook and shivered until we got them inside. Sometimes you just have to jump in and experience the ups and downs of life if you want to move forward.

I think that ministry and mission are other examples of experiences where it is better to just jump right in. We all like to be cautious and pick our timing, but we have to be careful that the timing does not pick us. If we sit and wait on the side of the pool only getting our feet wet we miss the experience of total immersion, the wonderful feeling of God's grace literally filling every pore and working through us for the good of the church. Sometimes this means taking risks, making changes, and doing something we have never done before. Not everything we try succeeds, but when they do they become new avenues for the church to grow and expand its commitment to God.

In the next few weeks I invited you to jump into the ministry of First Christian Church. Take part in our Wednesday Night programs, our Bible Studies, our Sunday School classes, youth and children's events, or choir. Invite one of your coworkers to a worship service, or a friend to one of our special event. Come to a committee meeting and hear about the work they accomplish. Become a part of the mission of the church and you will feel the Holy Spirit filling you and calling you to a new commitment to God.

INTERFAITH MISSION SERVICE

Did you know that one of the legacy agencies that Interfaith Mis-



sion Service (IMS) helped to start in our community is still actively serving? In 1985, IMS identified a severe shortage of transitional and low-income housing in Huntsville. Using the information from the study, a board of directors was established to organize Living in Family Transition (LIFT) Housing. LIFT Housing, now part of Family Services Center, continues to provide low cost housing for homeless persons until they can transition to more permanent housing.

LIFT Housing provides low-cost, income-based, short-term, case-managed, scattered-site emergency shelter (apartment style) housing to homeless families unable to reside in a traditional shelter setting. In addition, LIFT provides supportive services to help prepare families to move towards permanent affordable housing with the goal of achieving permanent housing by program's end. The program offers low-cost housing for verifiably homeless families with dependent children within the household, or those at imminent-risk of becoming homeless (as defined by federal guidelines).
