I have witnessed great poverty and experienced great cruelty that men heap on each other. I am not just talking about the basic necessities of life. I am also talking about love and spirit and faith and hope. I have had times when I could see no joy or hope or faith or it was well hidden. Out of some of the greatest tragedies of my life, God has created great joy and love and hope and abundance. God has blessed me with a beautiful

The greatest commandments Jesus gave us were "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength'. Then the world would see Jesus Christ in our faces and in our hearts. We would share a great feast and celebration with the world.
