### "NO SECRETS KEPT"

It has been said that the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the best kept secret within the denominations of America. Our focus on ecumenism, hospitality, social justice, and personal education as well as the autonomy of all sections of the church make for an interesting mix of ideologies and theologies. However, being the best-kept secret denomination is not a compliment. It means that those who are not associated with our church know nothing about us. Perhaps this is because when members of the Christian Church are asked about the values on which we base our faith we do not know how to answer because of our diversity.

Our former General Minister and President, Rev. William Chris Hobgood, writes "As different as we may be, as Disciples we share the most important thing-our belief in God and our confession of faith in Jesus Christ." He suggests that Disciples have five covenantal values that define us as a denomination. These five values are:

The confession of faith in Jesus Christ as Savior.

The hospitality of the Lord's Supper.

The call to ministry for all believers.

The love of unity.

The justice of God that orders all our actions.

As the season of Lent continues and as we look forward to the Easter season, our personal focus should turn from inward reflection to outward realization of our faith and practices. A part of the glory of Easter is the call of the great commission, to spread the good news of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth. For many of us this means doing something that can make us uncomfortable, sharing our stories of faith with others. We cannot let something so important to us remain a secret. We have to tell others how our relationship with Christ has transformed us, how our congregation has supported us, and how we have grown as Christians through the work of our leaders in our church, region, and beyond.

It is my hope that you will reflect on the covenantal values of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) so that the next time you are called on to share about your denomination you will be prepared. But I also hope that you will not wait until someone asks you. Our church should not be a secret, everyone in Huntsville, Alabama and beyond should know who we are and what we stand for.

"Through Jesus Christ, we come to know real connection with God, with each other and with the world."
