THE ART OF REST

But I am like an olive tree flourishing in the house of God; I trust in God's unfailing love for ever and ever. - Psalm 52:8

As I sat in the chair during my first worship service at Lexington Theological Seminary during my inperson classes in 2024, I tried to quiet the chatter in my mind - the endless thoughts about the 400 pages of reading that would soon be covered in class. They wanted us to focus on the worship service, but I found it hard to tune everything else out.

We sang our hymns, and then it was time for the scripture and sermon. The speaker, a professor at the seminary, opened her Bible to Psalm 52 and read the passage. She then delved into a topic we all needed to hear: the importance of rest in the success of our lives and ministries.

At first glance, you might struggle to find the connection between this psalm and the concept of rest. However, the context she provided changed my perspective entirely. She spoke about olive trees and their seasons of growth, focusing specifically on their period of dormancy. From December to February, olive trees rest - a necessary pause that ensures full fruit production in the following season. Without this period of dormancy, fruit production can be drastically affected. In other words, the olive tree needs rest to flourish.

In Psalm 52, the writer compares themselves to a flourishing olive tree, signifying that God has nurtured them, allowed them to rest, and, as a result, brought forth an abundant harvest from their efforts.

Rest is hard. But just as Lent prepares us for the resurrection of Jesus, it also offers us a chance to embrace rest as part of our spiritual preparation. Like the olive tree, may we allow ourselves the rest we need to flourish.
