Fleming Farms Circle has offered a monthly meeting opportunity for Fleming Farms residents as well as members of our congregation. Plans are currently being formulated to begin a sixth circle, "Lois and Eunice", named in honor of Timothy's grandmother and mother. This circle will meet on an alternate Wednesday evening beginning in September, and the goal is to provide intergenerational opportunities for the ladies of First Christian Church. The goal of CWM is to remain sensitive to the evolving needs of the community while engaging in study, service and fellowship.
